"Two fences of barbed wire plus 'Goon boxes' enclosed the camp. These guard boxes contained every possible device to prevent escape, such as searchlights, machine guns, rifles, telephones, field glasses and even a seismograph to record tunneling activities. The area accessible to prisoners ended with a guard rail twenty feet inside the barbed wire fence. Within the camp were 'ferrets' and 'weasels' who checked the barracks for escape activities. Since they came at night with specially trained dogs, it was risky to be out after dark."
