Post 9/11 GI Bill Payment Tiers

Individuals serving an aggregate period of active duty after September 10, 2001 of:	Percentage of Maximum Benefit Payable
At least 36 months	100%
At least 30 continuous days and discharged due to service-connected disability	
At least 30 months < 36 months	90%
At least 24 months < 30 months	80% *service less than 24 months, BCT/AIT not counted towards qualifying time
At least 18 months < 24 months	70%
At least 12 months < 18 months	60%
At least 6 months < 12 months	50%
At least 90 days < 6 months	40%

Post 9/11 GI Bill, Chapter 33

Tuition/Fees

Paid to school (as of 1 Aug 2015, up to \$21,084.89 per academic year)

Housing Stipend

- Paid to Veteran/Dependent
- BAH/E-5 with dependents based upon the zip code of the school
 - Must be full-time student to receive full BAH
 - Full-time distance learning: 1/2 BAH National average
 - Not received for attendance of 1/2 time or less

Books/Supplies Stipend

- Up to \$1,000 per year and paid to Soldier/Vet/Dependent (\$41.67 per semester hour)

- 15 year delimiting date from last REFRAD of at least 90 days

Montgomery GI Bill-Active Duty (MGIB), Chapter 30

Effective Date

- 1 July 1985 to present

Eligibility Requirements

- 2-3 yrs continuous AD
- \$1,200 pay reduction

Benefit Amount

- As of 1 Oct 2015, monthly rates up to \$1,789 (IHL) for 3+ yr enlistee; up to \$1,454 (IHL) for <3 yr enl
- VA pays Veteran directly
- Allows up to \$600 Buy-Up (up to \$150 extra per month)
- No tuition/fees or housing/book stipend

- 10 year delimiting date

Montgomery GI Bill-Selected Reserves (MGIB-SR), Chapter 1606

Effective Date

Remains in effect

Eligibility Requirements

- No contribution required
- Service in the Selected Reserves

Benefit Amount

- As of 1 Oct 2015, monthly rates up to \$368
- No Buy-Up option
- VA pays Veteran directly
- Use while in SELRES
- No tuition/fees or housing/book stipend

Reserve Educational Assistance Program (REAP), Chapter 1607

Effective Date

- Ended November 25, 2015
- Must meet eligibility requirements to continue using REAP benefits

Eligibility Requirements

- Requires active service
- Tiered payment rates (For 90 days < 1 yr receive 50%; For 1 yr < 2 receive 75%)
- No contribution required

Benefit Amount

- As of 1 Oct 2015, monthly rates up to \$1,431.20
- Allows up to \$600 Buy-Up
- VA pays Veteran directly
- No tuition/fees or housing/book stipend

Post 9/11 GI Bill

Quick Facts

- **Basic Eligibility**-At least 90 continuous days on AD (after 11 SEP 2001)
- **Payment Tiers**-40%, 50%, 60%, 70%, 80%, 90%, 100%
- **Benefit**-Tuition/Fees, BAH, & Book Stipend
- 15 year delimiting date
- Requires a fully honorable discharge

Active Duty Exclusions

- Service Academy contract period
 - 5 years of non-qualifying service (after RA commission)
- ROTC Scholarship (10 USC, 2107(b)) contract period
 - 4 years of non-qualifying service (after RA commission)
- Loan Repayment Program (LRP) contract period
 - 3 years of non-qualifying service (after BASD)
- Service terminated due to an erroneous or defective enlistment

Active Duty Exclusions (more)

- Annual Training conducted under authority of 10 USC 10147 or 12301(b)
- IRR in a non-active status
- Effective 1 Oct 2011 (payable), Title 32, Full-Time National Guard Duty in 502f status (some exceptions apply) was deemed as qualifying service backdated to 11 Sep 2001

Service Member Eligibility

- Continue on Active Duty or in Selected Reserve
- Fully honorable discharge from Armed Forces
 - Released for further service in a reserve component
 - Placed on retired list/temporary disability retired list
 - Transferred to Fleet Reserve, Individual Ready Reserve or Fleet Marine Corps Reserve
- Discharged or released for:
 - Hardship
 - Condition existing prior to service
 - Condition interfered with duty (CIWD)
 - Medical disability
 - Force-shaping

Conversion to Post 9/11 GI Bill (CH33)

Qualifying service prior to 1 AUG 2011

- CH30 conversion to CH 33: Individuals converting from MGIB (CH 30) to CH33 will be limited to remaining CH30 entitlement up to 36 months
- CH30 exhausted: Individuals with qualifying CH33 service who have exhausted all 36 months of CH 30 entitlements may be eligible for up to 12 months of CH33
- Ch1606 or 1607 conversion to CH33: Individuals converting from MGIB-SR or REAP will be limited to remaining CH1606/1607 entitlement and CH33 not to exceed a total of 48 months
- Once converted to CH33, the decision is irrevocable

48-Month Rule

- If you exhausted ALL benefits under another GI Bill program, you may be eligible for more benefits under Post 9/11 GI Bill
- Cannot receive more than 48 months under 2 programs; combined
- *As of 1 AUG 2011*, 2 periods of service are required
- Both periods of service must be fully honorable
- A break in service is not required

MGIB “Refund”

- Veterans who had a “reduction in pay” of \$1,200 toward MGIB may be entitled to a refund
- Only Veteran can receive the “refund”
- Only a Veteran receiving CH33 housing stipend can receive the “refund”
- Veteran must receive the housing stipend during last month of CH33 benefits to receive “refund”
- “Refund” will be minus taxes since initial allotment was a reduction in pay before taxes
- VA has final review of Veteran’s eligibility of “refund”

Election to Use Post 9/11 GI Bill (CH33)

(Usage by the Soldier)

- Soldiers who meet the basic eligibility criteria for CH33 should apply by completing VONAPP
 - <https://vabenefits.vba.gov/VONAPP/main.asp>
- Complete VA Form 22-1990
- Print a copy for your records
- Submit the form electronically
- Print a copy of application tracking #
- DVA will issue Certificate of Eligibility (COE) by mail
 - Provide COE to VA Certifying Official at your school

Tuition Assistance & Post 9/11 GI Bill

- Tuition/Fees not covered by TA
 - CH 33 days of entitlement reduced by # days multiplied by rate of pursuit
 - Enrolled 90 days at $\frac{1}{2}$ time rate equals 45 days of Post 9/11
- Books/Supplies
 - If Soldier wants to use Post 9/11 GI Bill to pay for “books & supplies only,” the Soldier must specify this with the school & VA
 - 1 day of entitlement for every \$41.67 paid-NOT the best use of GI Bill

Transferability of Education Benefits (TEB) to Dependents

Eligibility of Transfer to Dependents

RULE	YEARS OF SERVICE	ADDITIONAL SERVICE OBLIGATION
1	At least 6 years but less than 10 years	4 years from date request was submitted
2	10 or more years	Is precluded by either standard policy or statute from committing to 4 years but agrees to serve for the maximum amount of time allowed by such policy or statute
3	Is or becomes retirement-eligible (20 years)	Agrees to serve an additional 4 years of service

Temporary ADSO Rules

- From 1 Aug 2009 until 1 Aug 2013, temporary rules for ADSO's **EXPIRED**

RULE	YEARS OF SERVICE AS OF 1 AUG 2009	ADDITIONAL SERVICE OBLIGATION
3	20 or more years	No additional service obligation
4	Approved retirement date from 1 Sep 2009 to 1 Jun 2010	No additional service obligation
5	19 but less than 20 years	1 year service obligation from submission date
6	18 but less than 19 years	2 year service obligation from submission date
7	17 but less than 18 years	3 year service obligation from submission date

Expiration of 0, 1, 2, and 3-year ADSO Eligibility

- Effective 1 August 2013, Soldiers must have applied for TEB in order to qualify for a reduced service obligation
 - Any request after 1 August 2013 would result in a 4-year ADSO regardless of time in service

- Including Soldiers who are retirement eligible

Steps to Transfer

Step 1	Log into DoD TEB Web application at https://www.dmdc.osd.mil/TEB/	Use CAC, DoD Self-Service Logon, or DFAS (myPay) pin	
Step 2	Allocate at least 1 month to each eligible family member	Eligible dependents are spouse/children enrolled in DEERS and eligible for DEERS benefits	Spouse can use benefit up to 15 years from Soldier's separation date; children up to their 26 th birthday
Step 3	Check ALL boxes to indicate you have read/understand each statement	Including "Post 9/11 GI Bill, Chapter 33" box at the top left	All boxes must be checked including ones that don't pertain to you
Step 4	Submit request	Ensure that it clearly states "Submitted" at the top	Print a copy of your submission for your records
Step 5	Log back into DMDC portal (24-72 hours) to check status *Note obligation end date	Retrieve approval form and print for your records	Or dispute rejection

Transferability of Education Benefits Acknowledgements:

- a) I am eligible for the Post-9/11 GI Bill, the program I am applying to transfer.
- b) I understand I may transfer up to 36 months (or my remaining months of eligibility, whichever is less) of my education benefits to spouse and/or children, and can modify or revoke my election at any time.
- c) I understand that my spouse may use the benefit immediately and children (ages 18-24) after I have served 30 years.
- d) I understand and agree to remain in the Armed Forces for the period required. I understand that failure to complete that service may lead to an overpayment by the Department of Veterans Affairs for any payments made. (Service documentation will remain on file with the Service).
- e) I understand that I am responsible for any overpayments due to not completing my additional obligated term of service agreement.

TEB (Important Info)

- Request must be submitted prior to separation/retirement
 - After approval, may revoke or modify transfer
-
- Dependents cannot be added to TEB after separation, but months of entitlement can be modified only to dependents previously approved for TEB
 - Effective date is TEB request date (cannot be backdated)
 - Months transferred cannot exceed 36 months or the remaining unused months as determined by the DVA
 - Wards and Foster Children are not eligible

Steps for Dependents Using TEB

- Dependents who wish to use transferred benefits should apply by completing VONAPP

 - <https://vabenefits.vba.gov/VONAPP/main.asp>
 - Dependent must create their own VONAPP account
- Complete VA Form 22-1990e electronically
- Print a copy for your records with tracking #
- DVA will issue Certificate of Eligibility (COE) by mail
 - Provide COE to VA Certifying Official at your school
 - School COE will complete VA FORM 1999 and forward to VA

Dependents Usage

- Spouse using TEB Benefit
 - Same as Soldier's benefits, whether active duty or Veteran

 - Soldier on Active duty will have prorated tuition/fees & book stipend and not eligible for BAH stipend or YRP
 - Available after Soldier completes 6 years of service, makes election to transfer, and TEB is approved
 - Expires 15 years from Soldier's last release from Active Duty

Dependents Usage

- Dependent Children using TEB Benefit

- Same as Soldier's benefits, as if the Soldier is not on active duty
- Available after Soldier completes **10 years** of service
- Requires HS Diploma, GED, or age 18
- Must transfer before child's 21st birthday via DoD website
 - Cannot transfer on/after child's 23rd birthday
- Must use before child's 26th birthday
- Email usarmy.knox.hrc.mbx.tagd-deers@mail.mil if the child is listed incorrectly in DEERS

Non-Degree Programs

- Non-Degree programs such as:
 - Vocational/Technical Training: HVAC certification, CDL, EMT, Barber/Beauty school, etc.
 - OJT & Apprenticeship Training: Hotel management, firefighter, plumber, etc.
 - Flight Training: Flight engineer, dual-engine, etc. (Up to \$12,048.50 per year)
 - Correspondence Training: (Up to \$10,241.22 per academic year)
 - Licensing and National Testing Programs (Up to \$2000 per test)
 - Tutorial Assistance (Up to \$1200)
- Available to Soldier, Veteran, and Dependent
- Payments/qualifications vary by program

Tutorial Assistance

Up to \$1200

- Submit VA Form 22-1990t
- Only paid for attendance at an approved institution for an approved program
- Available to Soldier, Veteran, and Dependent
- Requirements
 - Professor/Tutor certifies tutoring is necessary to complete education successfully
 - Individuals is enrolled at least 1/2 time
 - Course is required to complete an approved education program

Oversees Institutions

- Post 9/11 GI Bill benefits can be used abroad at approved IHLs

- Maximum Tuition/Fees (\$21,084.89)
- National BAH rate (\$1566.00)




