

**U. S. Army War College
Seeks
Visiting Professor of National Security Studies**

The U.S. Army War College seeks a Visiting Professor of National Security Studies for the academic year 2005-2006. The selected candidate will be responsible for preparing future strategic leaders in their understanding of national security and strategy and will teach a seminar on national security affairs, national military strategy, and the nature of war as well as an elective in an associated field. He or she will also help develop curriculum in the areas of national security, political science, international relations, and strategy and represent the Army War College at symposia and conferences by speaking and presenting scholarly papers. A PhD in political science, national or international security studies, government, history, economics, or another field related to the study of national security with experience in professional military education is preferred but not required. The term of service which begins 27 June 2005 is for one year with a possibility of an additional renewal year. The successful candidate will be hired under the provisions of the Intergovernmental Personnel Act which governs the temporary assignment of personnel between the federal government and state and local governments and institutions of higher learning.
