Course Overview for Senior Mentors, Speakers, and Attendees

Core Mission and Objectives

Prepare senior officers to function effectively as land component commanders in joint, interagency, intergovernmental, and multinational environments.

Objectives: *Graduates of the Combined/Joint Force Land Component Commander Course will be able to:*

- *Plan, prepare, and execute* sustained land operations in support of coalition, interagency, intergovernmental, international, and Combatant Command policy objectives
- *Establish* a Combined/Joint Force Land Component Command headquarters
- *Integrate* with other functional and coalition commands (C/JFACC, C/JFMCC, and C/JFSOC)



C/JFLCC Topics & Scope



- **Roles and Responsibilities of the C/JFLCC.** Theater to JTF levels in forming and operating the multinational command.
- **Theater-level Strategy.** Integration of major land operations into the coalition and combatant commanders' plans amid dynamic conditions; essential elements of establishing and maintaining coalition cohesion and unity of effort.
- **Land Dominance Operations.** Operations that support the Combatant Command and coalition's theater policy objectives.
- **Combined Land Operations.** Operations with multinational forces, including the capabilities and limitations of national policy determinations within the coalition under a multinational command structure .
- **Political and Media Influences.** Operations within the parameters of guidance from a multinational command structure and integration with international organizations; participation by nongovernmental and international organizations; and interaction with the media.
- **Key Operational-Level Systems and Processes.** Establishment of effective systems for command and control of major land formations, information and intelligence sharing, synchronization and integration of multinational movement and maneuver, information operations and fires, operational protection, and logistics, specifically Joint Reception, Staging, Onward Movement, and Integration (JRSOI) and sustainment of joint and multinational forces.


