1. COL Funk provided opening remarks. He stated that the summer has been busy and he appreciates each individual identifying potential risks as they are noticed and sharing their observations with others to ensure each situation is improved. He asked that each member of the CHPC continue to be the eyes of the community and help to keep all professionals aware of situations and the command informed of what is observed. Addressing issues at this monthly meeting will help the command get out in front of issues and institute policies and procedures to deal with opportunities and gaps.

The CHPC/WBB Board members reviewed the 16 July 2014 meeting minutes. A motion was made by COL Porter to approve the July minutes, seconded by LTC Peeples, and approved by all.

2. Old Business:

An AAR/update of the June/July/August CHPC/WBB themed events and activities was completed.

- a. Mr. John Knowles stated that Ms. Ann Wolfe has the lead for the Suicide Prevention Task Force and Training. He presented the opportunities available for the USAWC and Garrison Staff/Faculty training sessions which will begin on 20

August. This is mandatory training for all military and DA civilian staff. On 20 August COL Porter will provide Suicide Prevention Training to the staff of AHEC from 1300-1500. There should be seating available if others choose to attend. There will also be a Train-the-Trainer session. Dr. Ines Roe, Behavioral Health (BH), DAHC, is producing a Suicide Prevention video, approximately 45 minutes in length, which will also be shown to various groups. The USAWC Faculty will lead the instruction of AY15 students by incorporating the mandatory training objectives into their seminar educational processes.

- b. COL (Ret) Thomas Salo will address Alcohol Awareness at the August Commander's Forum at Dunham Clinic.
- c. The Army Wellness Center is offering a 15 October event entitled, "Lift to Empower" about myths and benefits of strength training in the AWC Classroom. This presentation is targeted to women of the community, and will also offer nutrition information and demonstrations of some exercises.
- d. LTC Peeples stated that the various school-age welcome activities, the ice cream social, and the *Downtown Carlisle Welcome Jam* offerings for AY 15 class were well attended and very successful. On 15 August AUSA will sponsor an outdoor showing of the film, Jim Thorpe, All American, on Indian Field. There is also a youth bike rodeo taking place 16 August as well as a Department of Emergency Services open house with tours at the post firehouse on 20 August.
- e. The *Oktoberfest* with Volksmarch, Domestic Violence Prevention, and Cyber Safety Awareness activities are being planned for October.
- f. Ms. Myers, ACS Director, stated that ACS will provide live streaming of spouse and family relevant portions of the *AUSA Conference* held in October. She is currently determining the optimal VTC location on Carlisle Barracks.
- g. During the month of October The Red Ribbon Campaign for Drug and Alcohol Awareness will kick off with a youth poster contest. There will be "lunch and learn" activities scheduled for 29 October as well as pins handed out at the security gates.
- h. National Drug Take-Back Day is 27 September, 1000-1400, at AHEC.
- i. National Depression Screening Day is 9 October. Dunham Clinic's BH office will offer an anonymous on-line depression screening resource as well as present information on depression during Retiree Appreciation Day 11 October. Presentations on bullying are also being planned.

4. New Business:

- a. The Integrated Master Calendar Report: 90 Day Well Being "Significant Events" was reviewed. There were some events missing. Dr. Williams asked each organization to enter all pertinent activities and events in the Enterprise Event Manager on the USAWC portal to ensure it shows in the SIG ACTS.
- b. The McConnell Youth Center grand opening will take place 12 September.

- c. Ms. Myers will continue to make ACS Financial Outreach Assistance services known to the community.
- d. There are a large number of EFMP enrollees with this new class. Ms. Myers will provide a breakdown of EFMP issues to COL Funk.
- e. During the Community Fair there was interest expressed by several families for counseling service offerings available for adolescents.
- f. The Carlisle Barracks Army Wellness Center reports that 189 students have currently signed up for an assessment.

5. The meeting was adjourned at 1430.
